

JPMorgan Chase and SAMMinistries team to offer Subsidized Employment Training (SET), free money for your businesses

SAMMinistries will recruit and pre-screen qualified candidate trainees to meet your employment needs, and reimburse employers up to 50% of the trainee's wage for up to 12 weeks.

SAMMinistries' mission is to help the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless achieve self-sufficiency by providing housing, employment assistance, and education. The Subsidized Employment Training (SET) Program is a new partnership between JPMorgan Chase and SAMMinistries that is designed to bridge the "skills gap" by training and preparing individuals for employment in the high-demand fields of healthcare, information technology, and manufacturing. This is a unique opportunity for businesses to partner with the non-profit sector to meet their employment needs while helping individuals gain the skills and training necessary to acquire living wage jobs that enable them to support their families.

The initiative consists of two parts: First, SAMMinistries will recruit and screen interested candidates who are then interviewed by the employer for suitability. Second, the employer provides up to 12 weeks of training and considers a permanent employment offer to candidates at the end of the training period. SAMMinistries will reimburse employers for 50% of the trainee's wage during the training period, act as a liaison between the trainee and employer, and monitor progress. In the end, businesses will have access to a qualified pool of candidates, individuals will be prepared for employment, and the community as a whole benefits economically. The SET Program is a win-win situation for all involved!
